Julianne, 72, of Kennewick returned to her heavenly home on Thursday, June 20, following an unexpected cardiac event. Julianne was the oldest of two girls born to the late Rudolph and Cecelia Lak on December 12, 1946. She was raised in Reno, Nevada and graduated from the University of Nevada-Reno in 1968 with a degree in History. She then attended the University of Arizona, earning her Master's Degree in Education in 1970. It was during this time that she met David Turner, whom she married on June 27, 1970 in Reno. Shortly after, the couple moved to Windsor Locks, Connecticut. Julianne began teaching special education, and she was able to spend quality time with her Connecticut extended family.

A few years after the birth of their oldest daughter, the family relocated to Kennewick in 1978 due to David's employment within the nuclear industry. Shortly after, they welcomed their son and then a second daughter. Julianne resumed teaching special education at Horse Heaven Hills and Highlands Middle Schools, where she displayed strong dedication to her students for over 20 years.

Julianne was a long-time parishioner at St. Joseph's Parish and served within the Eucharistic Ministry, Children's Liturgy, and as an usher. She found and gave much support to a prayer group of women, who have been meeting together for many years. She attended countless sporting events to cheer on her children and later her grandchildren. Following her retirement in 2010, Julianne enjoyed her time serving food for Meals on Wheels, bowling in a Senior League, participating in various activities at the Community Center, attending pet adoption activities, traveling, frequenting plays and concerts, meticulously tending to her beautiful flower gardens, and spoiling her grandchildren.

Julianne's family, friends, and an array of animals were all recipients of her genuine, loving kindness. She was truly selfless and she especially enjoyed helping others and finding the perfect gifts for the people she loved. As a wife, mother, grandmother, and loyal friend, she is irreplaceable. While no one else can fill the void she leaves, her love and example of faith, kindness, and charity is ongoing to us.

Julianne is survived by her devoted husband, David; her children, Diana Turner-Eadie (William Eadie), Andrew Turner (Natalie Turner), and Christina Turner (James Kravontka);

her beloved grandchildren, Liam and Clara, Donovan and Everett, and Audrey; and her sister, Cecilia Lak.
