Peggy Jo Wright passed peacefully in her sleep on November 5. She resided in her home of 53 years in Pasco.

She was preceded in death by her husband, John Wright, (d. 2015), her husband from a previous marriage, Merle Locke (d.1994), and her parents Andres (d.1966) and Lucille (d. 1994) Kinnaird.

In 1982, she married John Wright. Together they ran Wright's Custom Upholstery in Pasco. John brought four children to the marriage: John, Jim, (d. 1996), JoAnne and Jeff Wright. Peggy treated them all as her own. Peggy is survived by dozens of grandchildren and great-grandchildren, all of whom she loved dearly.
